

HHCC health parameters for entering camp:

1. Parents/Guardians of campers—please note that all camp participants are to arrive to camp with no communicable disease signs/symptoms. These signs/symptoms of possible communicable disease/infection would include fever (oral temperature above 100.4 degrees F.), with the person having had no fever reducing medication that has been given to them within 72 hours prior to camp arrival, difficulty breathing, shortness of breath, cough, chills, muscle pain, sore throat, excessive fatigue, new loss of taste or smell, rash that has not already been diagnosed and deemed to be non infectious, or one or more nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea episodes within the last 3 days prior to camp arrival. Please notify camp prior to arrival if the camper has had recent exposure (within the last week) and/or close personal contact(s) to others (within the last week) that have exhibited communicable disease signs/symptoms. Medical documentation that the camper is free from infection and able to fully participate in camp activities may be required for the camper to attend.
2. Initial screening assessments will be completed upon arrival with each camper as a part of registration for camp. Should any illness signs/symptoms be present in the camper/staff at registration, the camp participant will be sent home with determination made by camp staff as to whether or when the camp participant may be allowed to return for a future week of camp later in the summer.
3. HHCC reserves the right to not admit a person who poses a communicable disease risk to others.
