Six students came to the US from China for one month this summer and attended Early Teen 2 one of those



weeks. What an opportunity! One of our SITers, Jimmy Dai, spoke Mandarin

and was a big help in translating and helping these kids to understand what was going on. He also bought a Chinese Bible for each of them. One of these students said as they left, "Before this camp, I don't know anything about Jesus, but now, I know many things about Him, and I believe God and Jesus." Pray for the Holy Spirit to continue working in the hearts of these young people.

Jessica Morel directed our Explorer Day Camps this summer and for the first time we had two of the three weeks full with waiting lists. The kids enjoyed horseback riding, swimming, crafts, eating lunch at the river, along with throwing rocks and looking for crawdads. They also got to do some hands-on cooking, rock climbing, and heard a Bible lesson each day. Ten children accepted Christ during Day Camp.

Continue to pray for the campers who attended this summer that the Lord will give increase to the seeds that have been planted. To God be the Glory! 🏰
